Kaniva Tonga News

I am currently editor of *Kaniva Tonga News*, the only Tongan-English news service in New Zealand. Our service is read by Tongans from Sydney to Salt Lake City and our stories have been carried by local, regional and international bodies, including the BBC. Our service can be found here: http://www.kanivatonga.co.nz Kaniva Tonga News shares its content with TVNZ/One News and has sharing arrangements with Radio New Zealand, Asia Pacific Report and the Pacific Islands News Association.

My work with *Kaniva Tonga News* includes creating the organisation's policies, economic and media strategies and making managerial and operational decisions. I review, edit, re-write, and lay out all stories on our website. I write stories or editorials that offer opinions on issues. Working on assignments and investigating news leads, I collect, verify and analyse newsworthy information so that we publish news stories with the reader's perspective in mind. I translate English stories into Tongan before publishing and sharing them to social media.

Ta'angafonua Charitable Trust

I founded the Ta'angafonua Charitable Trust which provides cultural services to the Tongan community through preserving our musical traditions and creating new music. We also provide educational services, including teaching Tongan through our online service at http://www.akoola.org.nz

As a member of the Trust I write original Tongan and English songs for our band to perform and record. I arrange existing English music to produce new Tongan compositions and translating English songs into Tongan.
